

## RE: Oppose HB 34 Oil Conservation Protect Health and Environment

Mr./Madame Chair and Committee Members:

Better Together New Mexico (BTNM) brings together hundreds of advocacy groups and thousands of New Mexicans statewide. Our mission is to unite New Mexicans through grassroots initiatives and work to positively shape the decisions that affect our lives, families, and communities.

BTNM respectfully opposes HB 34 Oil Conservation Protect Health & Environment and the committee substitute bill for the following reasons:

This amendment essentially gives the Oil Conservation Division (non-elected officials and employees) and the Oil Conservation Commission (non-elected volunteers) very broad powers. The phrase "do whatever may be reasonably necessary" without specific limitations or requirements for alignment with the stated sections of the law suggests that the division could interpret its mandate exceptionally broadly. This could lead to actions beyond what the legislature intended when it passed the original law.

Typically, state laws are detailed in their scope and application, with agencies having the authority to implement these laws strictly within the confines of what's written. This amendment, however, dilutes that control by allowing the division and commission to act based on a vague notion of what's "reasonably necessary." It shifts the balance of power from elected legislators, who draft laws reflecting public policy and voter interests, to unelected officials and citizens on a commission who don't have the same accountability.

By allowing actions "whether or not indicated or specified in any section of that act," the amendment could lead to regulatory overreach or actions that might not align with the legislative intent or public interest. This could mean changes in policy, enforcement, or even introducing new regulatory burdens without legislative oversight or public debate.

On behalf of hard-working New Mexicans and businesses, and for the reasons stated, we urge you to say 'NO' to the committee substitute for HB 34 Oil Conservation Protect Health & Environment
